We can build a homogeneous South Africa on the basis not of colour but of human values".

We can proudly declare today, that the Constitution of the Republic and the South African Foreign Policy, correctly and fundamentally represent the vision and aspirations of our people as articulated by Inkosi Albert Luthuli in his seminal writings and the people's document-the Freedom Charter.

The new democratic government has consistently strived for an African solution to African problems as part of our deliberate effort to ensure that the vision of Inkosi Albert Luthuli is indeed executed.

Finally, we would like to thank all spheres of government, departments, state institutions including behind the scenes stars, who have ensured that we celebrate the 40<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of Inkosi Albert Luthuli in a dignified and organized manner.

Our special thanks are due to the organizing team under the able leadership of Ms Nana Ngobese, Deputy Director General –Special Programmes-Premier's Office and Mr. Vusithemba Ndima, Chief Director: Heritage, Department of Arts and Culture.
